Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a good half term break.
Our Learning focus this half term is all about Autumn, Keeping Healthy and of course Christmas.

At pre-school, we will be supporting the children to make healthy choices at snack time and to taste new fruits and vegetables, and they have enjoyed making egg and cress sandwiches. We will be also be focusing on the importance of keeping teeth clean, good hygiene and enjoying lots of exercise activities. The staff will support children to be increasingly independent in their self-care, for example putting on their own coats and doing up the zip (Physical Development, EYFS 2021). We have been teaching children the "Hillside Flip" as a way of putting their coats on – ask your child to show you this new skill.

To extend your child's learning at home, please support them to keep healthy by being active – with walks or playing at the local park. You can also support your child's teeth cleaning and remind them of the importance of hand washing and hygiene.

Wellington Boots -

Although we realise that wearing Wellingtons in the wet weather is a good idea when walking to pre-school, we do not think that they are suitable footwear for children to be wearing indoors all day. If your child does come to pre-school in Wellies, please also send in their shoes so that they can be more comfortable indoors.

Pupil Premium and 30 hours funding -

If your family is in receipt of benefits (e.g. income support, income related employment or job-seekers) you may be entitled to Pupil Premium for your child. Pupil Premium is paid to the setting to help the education of your child – if you think you may be eligible then please speak to Mrs Ford.

If you think that you may be eligible for 30 hours funding for the first time in January 2026, the Government website <u>www.beststartinlife.gov.uk</u> has more information. (Click on the highlighted link and you will be re-direct to the page.) You must apply for this in the term before the funding is due, so if you think your child will be entitled from January now is the time to apply – before 31st December 2025.

Children starting school in 2026 -

The closing date for applications for First school places is 15th January 2026. You can apply for your child's place online by clicking **here** or by telephone on: **01305 221060**. The local schools are advertising their open days for parents to attend.

Easy Fundraising -
